### TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

The Council of the General Association of International Sporting Federations (GAISF), at its meeting in Monaco on 25th October 2000, noted with concern the serious situation facing air sports in many places throughout the world, as a result of ever-greater restrictions on the use of airspace for sporting and recreational purposes.

The Council affirms that regulatory authorities should allow air sport participants reasonable right of access to adequate airspace for sporting activities, and urges such authorities to take proper account of representations made on airspace issues by Member Organizations of the Fédération Aéronautique Internationale.
