

## Risk Profile


Previous Testing in FAI events

- Adverse Analytical Findings post-2003




## Risk Profile

## GAPS

- Not all air sports tested
- Limited number of competitions tested
- No Out-of-Competition testing
- Knowledge about use of TUEs
- Internal risk profiles for NACs (status)
- Follow-up action on aviation expectations



## **Proposed Actions**

- Ensuring that data is gathered from all air sports, at CAT 1 sanctioned events, through In-Competition testing
- 2. An education programme covering:
  - a) Personal responsibilities
  - b) The list of prohibited substances
  - c) The use of TUEs
  - d) The anti-doping process
  - e) The RTP
- Conducting Out-of-Competition testing, including the use of "targeted testing"



#### but remember ....

- We can identify <u>our</u> risk profile,
  - And the substances that we are most likely to want to detect,
    - And when we are most likely to be able to detect them in Out-of-Competition testing
- But the analysis of doping samples tests for ALL substances on the Prohibited List,
- And, WADA reserve the right to test anyone at anytime (not just the RTP)



## Next Steps

- In-Competition testing being required at all CAT I FAI sanctioned events
  - This will improve our database and enable us to better understand our risk profile
- A permanent FAI Anti-Doping Review Panel (ADRP) being established to review adverse analytical results
  - It is suggested that there be 2 or 3 permanent members with expert legal and WADA Code knowledge and that another 1 or 2 appropriate persons be appointed to the ADRP by the EB to review actual AAFs
- An Anti-Doping Advisory Group (ADAG) to be appointed by the Executive Board to provide oversight and review of the FAI Doping Plan
  - This Panel should be representatives of the ASCs and NACs and include person with subject matter expertise (medical and WADA Code)

## Next Steps

- 4. The persons nominated for the RTP to be drawn at random from all air sports by the ADAG in consultation with the relevant ASC President
  - It is suggested that we do not have enough data to identify specific "at risks" groups. Our obvious concern is the potential use of recreational drugs, which, regardless of WADA, we need to actively discourage
  - We can use the WADA testing to search for these substances
- 5. The persons on the RTP to be changed at least every 12 months (from a date to be established)
  - Other IFs apply all sorts of ways of shuffling their RTP. We should have a system that rotates the RTP amongst our top performers



## ... And

- 6. Whereabouts information be achieved through the ADAMS system or a suitable alternative, such as normal home address and contact telephone number, or through the use of smart phones
  - "Whereabouts" has the potential to be very intrusive and demanding
  - It may be that we have submit to WADA that the contact information associated with our electronic sporting licence gives us the ability to conduct satisfactory Out-of-Competition testing
- All Out-of-Competition testing to be contracted to an external organisation
  - We just do not have the resources, expertise or budget to be able to do this in-house
  - Formal discussions will start with potential providers after this weekend

## ... And

- 8. Out-of-Competition testing to be targeted in accordance with the WADA definition
  - WADA allows testing of athletes at specified times or locations regardless of whether they are in an RTP or not
  - Using this strategy would enable us to test for those substances we do not want present at our aviation events and to also test people about to participate in an event
  - This may be the most effective way, financially and educationally, for us to discourage the use of inappropriate substances
- TUEs to be managed through the ADAMS system to ensure security of the data, or a suitable alternative
  - TUEs involve sensitive personal medical data and so the transmission of that data needs to be secure
  - ADAMS may provide a secure way of requesting and approving TUEs, without it involving the any "whereabouts" data to be completed
