He has served as General Secretary, Treasurer and Vice President of the Fédération and is currently Président d'Honneur. Olivier has flown in 29 Fiestas in Albuquerque and has placed 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th in the overall Fiesta competitions. He has made many alpine flights in Germany, Austria and France. Olivier is well known for his extensive collection of historic ballooning equipment and decorative art.
